Congress created OGIS to serve as the Federal FOIA Ombudsman and our jurisdiction

- Provides mediation services to help resolve disputes between FOIA requesters and Federal agencies
- Strives to work in conjunction with the existing request and appeal process
- May become involved at any point in the FOIA administrative process

## OGIS does not:

- Compel agencies to release documents
- Enforce FOIA
- Process requests or review appeals
- Provide assistance outside the realm of FOIA
- Make determinations or dictate resolutions to disputes

I note that the Department of Justice's Office of Information Policy (OIP), in response to Appeal No.

affirmed the FBI's response that it found no records responsive to your request regarding

We learned that although the February 5, 2014 response letter informed you that the FBI searched its Central Records System index, the agency actually searched the Criminal, Cyber, Response, and Services Branch for information responsive to your request. (The letter appears to use standard language that the FBI uses in many of its responses.) You may wish to submit a new FOIA request to the FBI specifically asking the agency to search its Data Intercept Technology Unit and its Finance Division. The FBI's Finance Division is responsible for the overall coordination and administration of the FBI's budgetary and fiscal matter, financial planning, voucher and payroll matters, and property and procurement activities. The more specific you are about what you seek, the better able an agency is to search for records responsive to your request.

Mr. Hurd informed OGIS that just because the FBI found records not mean that the agency will find records

In your request for OGIS assistance, you note that the online The Daily Dot reported on

Please know that information reported in the media may not be releasable under FOIA, and does not automatically act as a waiver of an agency's ability to withhold the information under FOIA. Regarding information reported by The Daily Dot, please know that in order for the information to be released under FOIA, the information must have been officially disclosed, not obtained through a source or other means, and such that an authoritative government official released the information publicly. Furthermore, Federal courts have consistently ruled that prior public disclosure must "match" the exempt information being sought.

In cases such as this where an agency is firm in its position, there is little for OGIS to do beyond providing more information about the agency's actions. I hope that this information about your request is useful to you.

At this time, there is no further assistance OGIS can offer and we will close your case. Thank you for bringing this matter to OGIS.
